Upon completion of the video in January 2003, the Everett Herald Newspaper ran a front-page article entitled, “Filmmaker slays his old dragons”. Below is an excerpt from that article that makes for a great review.

“The film is partly a health lesson, with graphic footage of the damage heroin causes to users’ bodies, plus firsthand accounts from people addicted to the illegal drug. Other scenes draw heavily on DuBois’ Christian faith; emphasizing his view that heroin is a tool of the devil. The film gives a brief history of heroin before showing viewers an unflinching look at the effects of the drug. In several scenes, the camera zooms in on bleeding abscesses on users’ arms and legs. DuBois also rode along with Seattle medics who worked to revive a man dying from a heroin overdose, filmed an addict shooting up in Seattle and included photos of the bodies of several men dead from heroin overdoses. Yet

the film’s most compelling moments are DuBois’ interviews with current and former heroin users, including a suburban housewife who used to have a \$130-a-day habit.”
